

Legal Form and Organisational Structure



Shareholders/Assembly of Shareholders

GVL has had three shareholders since August 1, 2019: The Bundesverband Musikindustrie e.V. (BVMI) for the producers' side and the Deutsche Orchestervereinigung e.V. (DOV) and the Bundesverband Schauspiel e.V. (BFFS) for the performers' side.

The Bundesverband Schauspiel e.V. has become the third shareholder of GVL with effect from August 1, 2019 and has taken over 1,000 shares of the Deutsche Orchestervereinigung e.V.; the Deutsche Orchestereinigung e.V. now holds 12,000 shares. The shares held by the Bundesverband Musikindustrie e.V. remain unchanged at 13,000.

Assembly of Rights Holders/ Assembly of Delegates

The 22 members of the Assembly of Delegates – a total of 12 delegates in the performer category and 10 delegates in the producer category – are elected every four years during the Assembly of Rights Holders; most recently on May 5, 2017. The Assembly of Delegates represents the GVL rights holders.

Assembly of Shareholders and Delegates

The Gesellschafter- und Delegiertenversammlung (GuDV) is a joint committee of the Assembly of Shareholders (BVMI, DOV and BFFS) and the Assembly of Delegates. The Assembly of Shareholders and Delegates is, among other things, involved in setting up, amending and modifying distribution regulations, general investment policies with regards to the revenue generated from rights, rights administration conditions and tariff policies (please also refer to the Articles of Association, Article 6.5).

Supervisory Body

GVL has a Supervisory Body consisting of two members – one representative from the category producer and one representative from category performer. These representatives were elected by the GVL shareholders. The Chairman of the GuDV and his deputy participate permanently as delegate representatives (without voting rights). The Supervisory Body consisted of the following members as at December 31, 2019:



Dr. Florian Drücke (elected by the Federal Association of the Music Industry)



Gerald Mertens (elected by the German Orchestra Association)



Detlev Tiemann (pursuant to Article 11 (1) of the Articles of Association)



Philipp von Esebeck (pursuant to Article 11 (1) of the Articles of Association)

The Supervisory Body is a voluntary institution and has the task – in addition to its own competences, such as the conclusion, the contents and the termination of representation agreements – to supervise the activities of the GVL and its general management. The Supervisory Body reports to the Assembly of Shareholders and Delegates on its activities at least once per year.

General Management

GVL is managed by its two Managing Directors of equal standing, **Dr. Tilo Gerlach** and **Guido Evers**, who are appointed by the GVL shareholders. Dr. Tilo Gerlach is mainly responsible for performers; Guido Evers is predominantly in charge of the sector including producers of sound recordings, producers of music video clips and event organisers. They are the legally authorised representatives of the company.



Notes for the 2019 Financial Year

General statements

The Gesellschaft zur Verwertung von Leistungsschutzrechten mit beschränkter Haftung (GVL) has its registered office in Berlin. It is entered in the commercial register of the Charlottenburg District Court under company registration number HRB 92075 B.

Pursuant to Section 267 (3) HGB [German Commercial Code], the company is a 'große Kapitalgesellschaft' [large limited liability company].

The annual accounts for the 2019 financial year have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the German Commercial Code in conjunction with the accounting regulations for collective management organisations/music licensing companies pursuant to Section 57 (1) clause 1 VGG [German Collecting Societies' Act]. The supplementary provisions of the 'GmbH-Gesetz' [German Act on Limited Liability Companies] were observed.

The structure of the annual financial statements is in accordance with the commercial law provisions of Section 264 et seq. HGB.

Accounting and Valuation Methods and Notes to the Balance Sheet

Fixed assets

The development and breakdown of the individual <u>fixed asset</u> items are shown in the summary of fixed assets on page 18.

Intangible assets and tangible assets are stated and valued at acquisition cost, taking into account scheduled depreciation. The straight-line depreciation rates on which the calculation of depreciation is based generally take into account the standard useful lives of between three and 50 years, which are also recognised for tax purposes. For additions during the fiscal year, depreciation is calculated pro rata temporis.

The fixed-interest securities of the Landesund Hypothekenbanken amounting to €16,436k reported under financial assets are accounted for at lower fair values in accordance with Section 253 (3) clause 6 HGB. Unscheduled depreciation in the financial year amounted to €204k. At the same time, securities amounting to €7k were added. The shares in affiliated companies also reported under this item are still carried at cost. For four investments in companies under civil law and in the absence of a capital contribution, a memorandum item of €1.00 each was formed in order to comply with the requirement of completeness in accordance with Section 246 (1) HGB.

Current assets

Receivables from trade and services relate to the remuneration entitlements of performers and producers of sound recordings managed by GVL under the Copyright Act for the broadcasting and cable retransmission of commercially published sound recordings including music video clips and for the public performance and reproduction of commercially published sound recordings, music video clips and radio broadcasts, as well as for the rental and lending of sound recordings and video cassettes and for the cable retransmission of other performances. Receivables were generally carried at their nominal amount. They include, among others, amounts receivable from the ZPÜ, Munich, of €67,500k. As the applicable distribution key was determined by the shareholders of ZPÜ for the PC levy, GVL's claim/amount receivable was estimated on this basis and on the entitlements accounted for at the ZPÜ. ZPÜ has not made a payment of €67,500k to GVL so far. In addition, an estimated claim against GEMA in the amount of $\in 3,745$ k has been accounted for, as no settlement has yet been made in this respect either.

Other assets mainly contain receivables from the tax office for Value-Added Tax (€690k) and from financial institutions for interest on fixed-term deposits not yet invoiced (€477k).

Recognisable risks were taken into account by making (in some cases estimated) individual value adjustments totalling €2,291k. During the financial year, an addition to value adjustments for receivables amounting to €53k and write-offs of receivables amounting to €347k were made. At the same time, (estimated) individual value adjustments amounting to €126k were made.

Cash and cash equivalents include overnight deposits of €55,117, and fixed-term deposits for the distribution of €438,502k which were invested at various banks subject to yielding interest. They were recognised at nominal value. Cash in hand, which is also included, is recognised at nominal value.

Equity

The share capital of the company shown as subscribed capital remains unchanged at €26k, whereby a share of €1k was transferred from the German Orchestra Association e.V. to the new shareholder Bundesverband Schauspiel e.V. in the financial year.

Reserves

The reserves for the distribution include amounts to be paid out to eligible producers (taking into account advance payments) according to the distribution regulations in the following year: In the following year, the initial distribution is made to the performing artists, reduced by projected future claims for subsequent distributions in the next three years, increased by the addition of interest income for the respective distribution period. Due to the (net) amounts receivable from ZPÜ (€65,500k) and GEMA (€3,150k) not collected on the balance sheet date and beyond, these amounts have, for the time being, been blocked in their entirety for distribution, as liquidity is not available in this respect.

Reserves for pension liabilities (€8,662k) were assessed using the Projected Unit Credit Method (Anwartschaftsbarwertverfahren [method to establish accrued entitlements at market valuel) and using the 2018 actuarial tables by Heubeck AG, Cologne. Instead of the market interest rate adequate to the residual term, the option of an estimated average market interest rate for an assumed remaining term of 15 years was applied. Accordingly, the applicable accounting discount rate is 1.97% p. a. for a seven-year average and 2.71% p. a. for a ten-year average. Furthermore, expected salary increases of 3.00% p. a. and a pension trend of 2.00% p. a. were taken into account. The difference, subject to a distribution stoppage in accordance

with Section 253 (6) HGB between the amount of the reserves in accordance with the corresponding average market interest rate from the last ten business years and the amount of the reserves in accordance with the corresponding average market interest rate from the last seven (1.97%) business years amounts to €1,013k.

The <u>tax reserves</u> include amounts from future VAT liabilities to the tax office, probably in this amount, from estimated claims against GEMA amounting to €245k.

Other reserves take into account all identifiable risks and other uncertain liabilities. They are assessed at the settlement amount level that can be reasonably estimated on the basis of sound

commercial judgement in order to cover future payment obligations. Future price and cost increases are taken into account if there is sufficient objective evidence of their occurrence. Significant reserves with a residual term of more than one year do not exist. reserves with a residual term of up to one year are not discounted.

Liabilities

<u>Liabilities</u> to rights holders from the <u>distribution</u> include amounts from initial and subsequent distributions as well as from final distributions, which must be available for a period of up to three years.

The liabilities are reported at the settlement amount.

Interest expenses mainly include the compounding of interest on pension provisions (€840k) in accordance with the provisions of the German Commercial Code.

<u>Grants</u> for cultural, social and culturalpolitical purposes were made in accordance with the guidelines issued for this purpose. The basic amount available for distribution decreased by €14,305k year-on-year to €180,012k; less the blocked funds of €68,650k, €111,362k remain for the 2019 financial year.

Receivables that had not been settled by payment by the time the annual accounts were prepared are shown as <u>blocked funds</u> in order to prevent payment to the rights holders prior to the liquid collection of the exploitation revenues.

Other Information

Contingent liabilities

There were no contingent liabilities requiring disclosure on the balance sheet date.

Other financial liabilities

On the balance sheet date, there were other financial liabilities in the amount of \in 193k. They mainly affect leasing contracts for vehicles (\in 42k) up to 2022 and office rent (\in 137k) until 2021.

Number of employees

In 2019, the company had an average of 175 (previous year: 151) staff (without the Managing Directors). Salaries and wages changed as a result of the tariff and agreed adjustments.

Shareholdings

The company held shares in the Initiative Musik, gemeinnützige Projektgesellschaft mbH [non-profit project company], Berlin, of €24.9k. This equals to a stake of 99.6%. Equity amounted to €420k as at 31 December 2019. In 2019, an annual surplus of €136k was reported.

GVL is a shareholder with unlimited liability in the following companies:

- Zentralstelle für private Überspielungsrechte, Munich, Gesellschaft bürgerlichen Rechts
- Zentralstelle für Videovermietung, Munich, Gesellschaft bürgerlichen Rechts

Auditors' fees

The (anticipated) total auditors' fees for the 2019 financial year amount to €97k, of which €85k is attributable to the audit of the financial statements and €12k to the preparation of the tax return.

Transactions with related parties

The company has concluded an agreement with a shareholder to share in the costs of piracy prosecution. The expenditure for the 2019 financial year amounted to €600k.

General Management

The company is jointly represented by two Managing Directors or by one Managing Director together with a Prokurist [executive with special statutory authority].

Managing Directors in the financial year were:

Mr Dr. Tilo Gerlach, Lawyer, Berlin, and Mr Guido Evers, Lawyer, Berlin.

With regard to the disclosure of Managing Directors' salaries, the company makes use of the exemption provision under Section 286 (4) in conjunction with Section 285 (9a) and (9b) HGB.

The reserves for current pension liabilities for former members of the General Management amount to €3,902k.

Events of particular significance after the reporting date ("Supplementary Report")

From today's perspective, General Management expects the current Covid-19 pandemic to have a significant impact on the company's financial situation. Revenues are expected to decline in all subdivisions as a result of the loss of receipts not foreseeable by the reporting date. The extent cannot be estimated at the moment; it depends largely on how long the pandemic-related restrictions in the entertainment industry and the reluctance of consumers and the advertising industry to spend will continue. For details, please refer to our comments in the Management Report* under section C.2 on "Forecast".




