Manual my.gvl

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Introduction

my.gvl is the portal for eligible artists of GVL. Its central component is the product search. Here, productions to which our beneficiaries have contributed can be searched for and displayed. Using the products found, one's own participation can be reported. This active notification of participation is mandatory for receiving remunerations by GVL

Prerequisite for usage: the rights management agreement

In order to use GVL artists' portal my.gvl, you must be a beneficiary of GVL. For this purpose, it is necessary to sign an online rights management agreement. The administration agreement enables GVL to administer your ancillary copyrights from secondary exploitation on your behalf and to distribute the proceeds to you. The rights management agreement can be applied for online via the following link: LINK

With the conclusion of the management agreement, access to the artists' portal my.gvl is also set up.

Opening the portal

You can access our portal by entering https://www.mygvl.de in the address bar of your browser or by clicking on this link.

Login and navigation

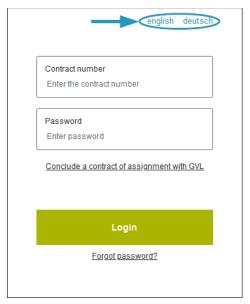
In the following, we would like to introduce you to the functionality of the product search, as well as the other features of my.gvl.

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Change language

Already on the login page of my.gvl you can choose between the languages German and English. The menus and information provided will be displayed according to the language setting. The language selection can be found in the top right corner of the login window.



You can also change the language setting at any time after logging in. You will find the corresponding button in the top right-hand corner by the globe symbol.

Setting up a password and logging in

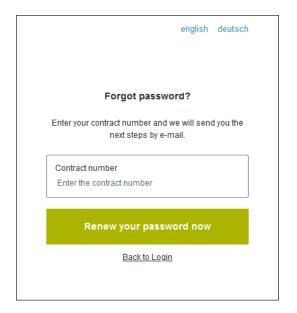
As soon as the contract has been finalized, you can use our artist portal. To log in, you will need your contract number - which you will find in your contract and usually in our initial e-mail correspondence - and a password. You must choose this password yourself when logging in for the first time. For this purpose, a link will be sent to you by e-mail. If this is not the case, you can also set up a new password yourself.

To do this, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open https://mygvl.de in the browser
- 2. On the login page, click on the "Forgot password?" link.
- 3. On the page that opens, enter the contract number assigned to you by GVL and click on the "Renew your password now" button.
- 4. An e-mail will now be sent to the e-mail address registered with GVL, containing a link to set your password.
- 5. Open the link and follow the instructions for assigning a password.

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After you have successfully assigned a password, you can now log in to our artist portal my.gvl with your contract number and the password you have chosen.

If you have problems with the login process, please have a look at the FAQ in the <u>Troubleshooting/FAQ</u> section. If this does not help, please feel <u>free to contact us</u>.

my.gvl starting page

After the successful login you will reach the starting page of my.gvl by default. Here you will find current news and important information for artists. By clicking on a news item, you can view the entire text of a piece of news. The "Back" button at the end will take you back to the starting page.

At the top right you will find some buttons or icons.







The button **"Open cases"** (1) leads you to cases where your assistance is needed, e.g. by providing us with evidence of your participation.

At the **globe icon** (2) you have the option to change the language setting at any time and switch between German and English.

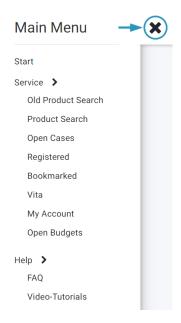
The **playing piece icon** (3), also at the top right of the page, displays your name after a mouse click. There you also have the option to log out again.



The **main menu** of my.gvl can be found at the top, left side of the page. In the collapsed state, you will see three horizontal lines as a symbol - a so-called hamburger menu.



When unfolded, the menu items are visible. The menu can be closed again by clicking on the large X.



The services and the help section are provided with submenus that can be opened and closed by clicking on the arrow icons and lead you directly to separate subpages.

We would like to briefly introduce these subpages in the following.

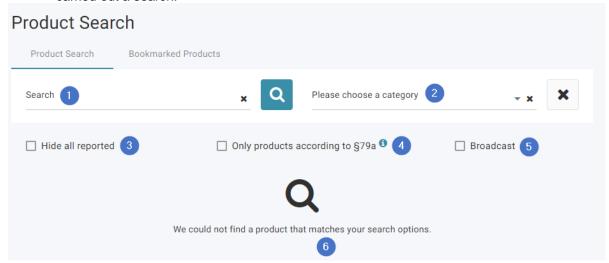


The product search

You can access the product search by clicking on the corresponding entry under "Service" in the main menu.

On the start page of the product search you will find

- a free text field in which you can enter your search terms (1),
- -a category selection to search for specific media types, with special search and filter options (2),
- -the general filters "Hide all reported" (3), "Only products according to §79a" (4) and "Broadcast" (5),
- the **result list** with found productions (6). This contains results as soon as you have successfully carried out a search.



Free-text search

The free-text search is the basis for the search. It searches all sections of the products for the entered term(s) and returns relevant hits, if available.

The following sections are searched via the free text search:

- Title, Album title, Episode title, Original title
- Main artist
- Cast lists including role names
- Broadcast content information
- EAN, label code, ISRC

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- Episode/Season numbers
- GVL product ID

Please note that not all information is always available.

With the X at the end of the input field you can delete your input again. If the number of hits is too large, general filters can limit the search result of the free-text search. In addition, you can use quotation marks to search for terms in context and thus obtain more precise results. Note that this is not an "exact" search in the literal sense of the word, since particularly common words, such as articles, are ignored.

In addition, it is possible to **select a category** (film and series, sound recordings, radio productions, stage productions, video clips). Within the categories there are additional filter options, which are described below.

Only if the free text field is filled with at least **two contiguous characters**, a search can be executed. To start the search, click on the blue magnifying glass icon or press the Enter key directly after entering the search text.

Alternatively, it is possible to leave the free text field empty but select a category to perform a search via the magnifying glass icon. Filters can be used optionally afterwards.

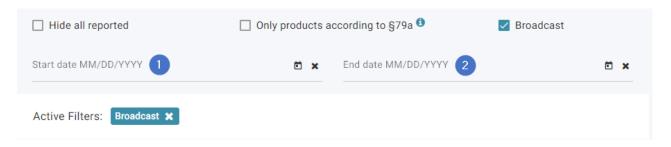
General filters

Hide all reported

The filter "Hide all reported" can be switched on and off by setting a check mark in the square. It restricts the search results in such a way that productions for which a participation notification of the logged-in beneficiary already exists are no longer displayed.

Broadcast

If this filter is set, the result list will only show products for which there is usage reported, i.e. broadcast information. If the filter is not used, the results list will also show products that have not been broadcast since 2010. (The database goes back to the year 2000 but does not claim to be complete).



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Optionally, the results list can be limited to broadcasts within a specific time period. The entry field for the time period (in the format DD.MM.YYYY) with a start date (1) and an end date (2) is only activated when the filter is selected.

Earliest possible date: 01.01.2010Latest possible date: the current day

CET applies.

It is not mandatory to enter a time period.

Special entries:

Single entry in "Start date" (without entering an end date): shows all products with usages from the start date to the current date.

Single entry in "End date" (without entering a start date): shows all products with uses from 01.01.2010 to the selected end date.

Only products according to §79a

If this filter is set, only products with extension of the term of protection according to §79a UrhG are displayed

In the result list, you can recognize the corresponding products by the paragraph symbol ("§").

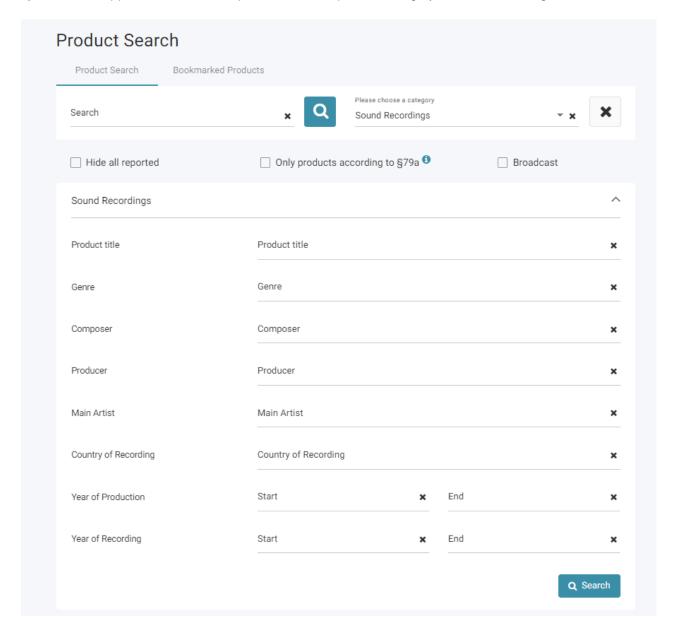
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Categories and category-dependent filters

Please note: the use of the category-dependent filters is optional. Inputs can be made here that would improve the search result, should this be necessary. More about this in the section <u>"Example search queries".</u>

After selecting a category, a separate filter area opens, which can be expanded and collapsed via the arrow symbol in the upper line. Here in the picture, for example, the category "Sound Recordings".:



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Since some of the filters are displayed in several categories, the filters are described here individually and not bundled by category. A table below shows in which category the filters are present in each case.

Free-text search "Product title"

The products are searched only in the field "Production title" based on the search terms entered here. In this way, search results can be better narrowed down if necessary.

Free-text search "Composer"

The products are searched for listed composers based on the entries in this field.

Free-text search "Producer"

The products will be searched for listed producers based on the entries in this field.

Free-text search "Main Artist"

The products will be searched for listed main artists based on the entries in this field.

Free-text search "Director"

The products will be searched for listed directors based on the entries in this field.

Free-text search "Broadcast Content"

The products will be searched for according entries in the field "Broadcast Content".

Filter "Type"

The filter "Type" is only available in the category "Radio Productions". It offers the option to search either for "Radio Productions Music" or "Radio Productions Voice", the latter referring to spoken word contributions, mostly in German.

The filter offers both options in a drop-down menu. If no option is selected, all radio productions are displayed.

Filter "Genre"

This filter allows you to filter by the relevant genres depending on the selected category.

In the "Film and Series" category, the selectable genres are:

- Soap Telenovela
- TV film
- Anime and cartoon films TV
- Series
- Cinema movie

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- Anime and cartoon films cinema
- Anime and cartoon film series

Please note: "cinema film" in this context means that the film has been produced for distribution in cinemas. For remuneration, a production must have been broadcast on a station under evaluation by the GVL.

In the category "Sound Recordings" the selectable genres are:

- Classical music
- Audiobook/radio play
- Popular music
- Archive music
- Children's programme
- Theatre/Comedy

In the "Radio Productions" category, the "Type" filter must first be used to determine whether the production is a "Radio Productions Music" or a "Radio Productions Voice".

In the "Radio Productions Music" category, the selectable genres are:

- Archive music
- Classical music
- Popular music

In the category "Radio productions word" the selectable genres are:

- Audiobook/radio play
- Children's programme
- Radio Feature
- Cabaret

In the "Stage Productions" category, the selectable genres are:

- Theater/Comedy
- Classical music
- Popular music

There are no subordinate selectable genres in the "Video clips" category.

Filter "Country of Recording"

Choosing a country of recording from a list will search the products for the selected country.

Filter "Country of Production"

Selecting a country of production from a list will search the products for the selected country.

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Filter "Year of Production"

Restricts the search to selected years of production (value range: 1901 to current year).

Note: For sound recordings, the production year is not as important as the recording year and is not always contained in the product data.

Filter "Year of Recording"

Restricts the search to selected years of recording (value range: 1901 to current year)

Filter "Radio stations"

The filter "Radio stations" allows to limit the search to products broadcast on specific radio stations.

The selection is made via a drop-down menu, which provides possible radio stations.

Note: Not every radio station is also relevant for distribution. For an overview of the distribution-relevant stations, please check the <u>distribution plans</u>.

Filter "TV stations"

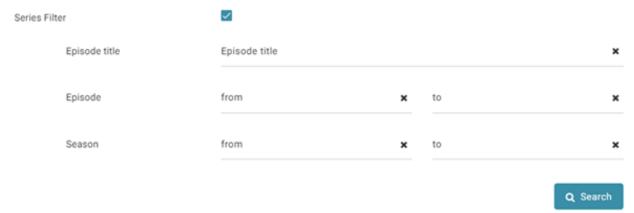
The filter "TV stations" filter makes it possible to limit the search to products broadcast on specific TV stations.

The selection is made via a drop-down menu, which provides possible TV stations.

Note: Not every TV station is also relevant for distribution. For an overview of the distribution-relevant stations, please check the <u>distribution plans</u>.

Series Filter

Ticking the "Series filter" box in the "Film and series" and "Stage productions" category activates three specific filtering options.



All filters can be applied individually, as well as combined with each other.

Episode title

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This filter enables a free-text search in the corresponding field.

Episode

This filter allows to narrow down episode numbers within the range of available products provided with corresponding information.

Season

This filter allows to narrow down season numbers within the range of available products provided with corresponding information.

Which filters are available in which categories?

The following table indicates the availability of a filter in the corresponding category with an "X".

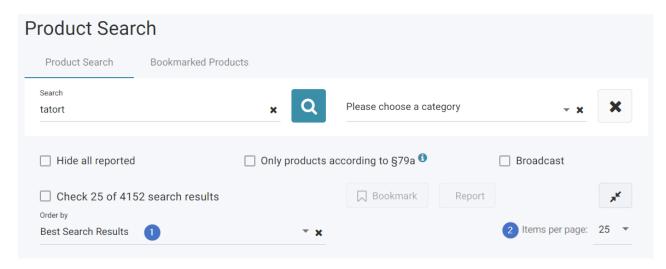

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The result list

When a search is performed for the first time, the search results are sorted in descending order based on the closest match to the search query ("Best Search Results").



By clicking in the "Order by" field (1), the search results in the list can be arranged according to one of the following product attributes:

- Title
- Main Artist
- Episode Title
- Season Number
- Episode Number

Via the selection field "Items per page" (2) up to 500 results can be displayed on one page. The default setting is 25.

The product display

The product display in the results list always shows at least a product title and a unique Production ID as well as additional attributes that depend on the respective media type. The media type is represented by an icon in the upper right corner.

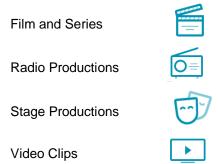
Possible are:

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Depending on the media type as well as the quality of the supplied data, a product may have the following information in addition to a title and the Production ID:

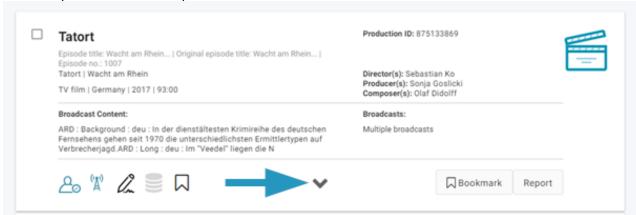
- Original title
- Season/episode information
- Category/genre
- Recording country/country of production
- Recording year/production year
- ISRC
- Duration
- Main performer
- Directors
- Composers
- Producers
- Broadcast Content
- Broadcasts
- Contributors

If a field is too long or contains several entries, more information can be found in the detailed view of the product. This can be expanded and collapsed via the arrow symbol.

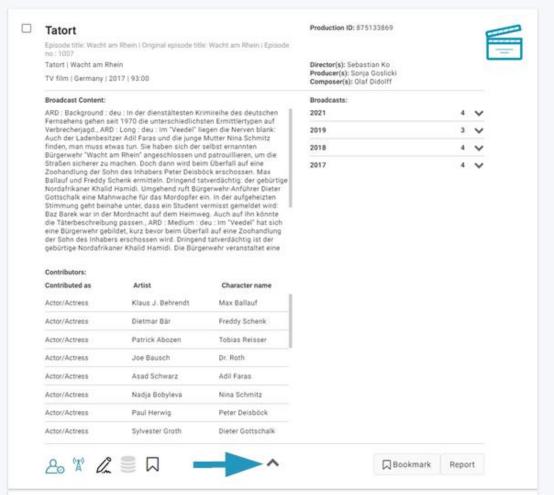
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View of a production with collapsed details:



View of a production with details expanded:

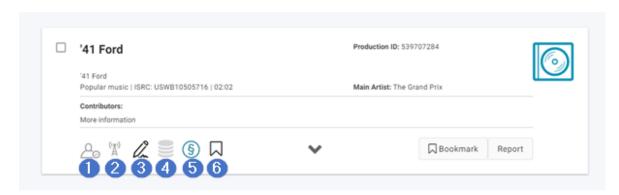


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The toolbar

Besides the text information, all products also include a toolbar.



- If the **playing piece icon** (1) is blue, this indicates that at least one participation message has already been submitted by the logged-in beneficiary for this product. If there is no submitted report yet, the icon is gray.
- The **transmission tower symbol** (2) in blue indicates that at least one piece of usage or transmission information is available for this product. You can see this in the detailed view. (In the case of played audio recordings, however, there is no individual listing of the broadcasts). If no such information is available, the symbol is gray.
 - Please note: Since the selection of stations evaluated by GVL changes annually, the presence of usage information does not necessarily mean that remuneration will be paid.
- The pencil icon (3) initiates the submission of a participation report by clicking on it. Alternatively, you can also use the "Report" button on the right-hand side.
 How the submission of a report works and how to submit reports for several related products at once, e.g. episodes of a series, is described below in the chapter on <u>submitting participation</u> reports.
- The **collective product symbol** (4), when colored blue, indicates that it is an album or a radio concert with several tracks. Notifications cannot be submitted on the collective product, but only on the associated individual products.
- The **paragraph symbol** (5) indicates that the product has an extended term of protection according to §79a UrhG. For all other products, the symbol is not present.
- The bookmark icon (6) adds the product to the list of bookmarked products by clicking on it, in
 case you want to submit a participation report at another time.
 For more information on this function, see the "Bookmarked" chapter.

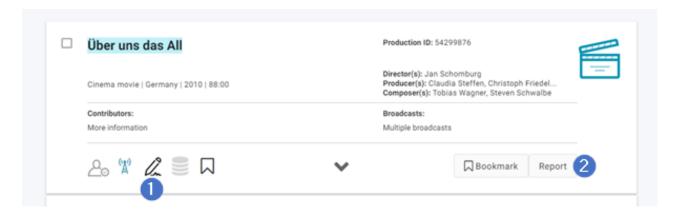
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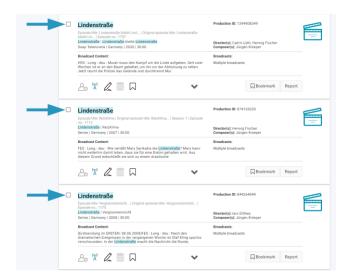
Submitting participation reports

Important: Before submitting a participation report, please make sure that you have not yet reported an identical participation for the corresponding product. Identical reports on a production lead to the data situation becoming confusing both for you as the beneficiary and for us. Existing notifications can be recognized as described above by the fact that the **game figure icon** in the results list is blue. Details of existing reports can be found in the "Registered" section.

The submission of participation reports takes place via the so-called report dialog. This can be initiated via the pencil icon (1) or the "Report" button (2) on the corresponding product.



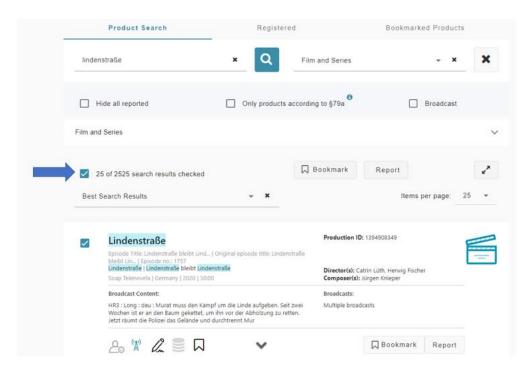
In addition, it is also possible to select several products from the results list and start the message dialog for this selection. To do this, a check mark must be placed in the small square to the left of the product title by clicking on it. Clicking it again will deselect the products.



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By clicking on the small square to the left of the display of the total search results, all entries of the respective page can be marked in total, i.e. 10, 25, 100 or 500 products, depending on the display setting. This action can also be undone by clicking again.



In addition, individual products in the results list can be subsequently deselected or re-selected by clicking on the square next to the corresponding title.

Please note:

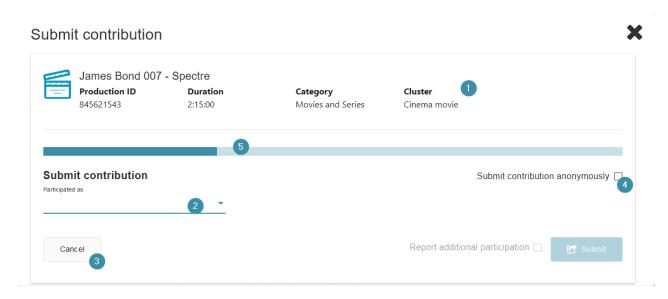
- Currently, you should initiate the report dialog for a **maximum of 100 productions** at a time, as more messages cannot yet be processed and an error message will be the result. To the left of the total number of search results, you will always see how many products you have just selected.
- No participation reports can be submitted on collective products themselves, only on the associated individual products.

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The report dialog

After clicking on one of the report buttons, the final report dialog opens. Here you are progressively asked for additional information regarding your participation.



- The **upper half** (1) first displays the title and additional information (product number, duration, category and rubric) for the selected production.
- The **drop-down menu** (2) asks for the contribution role, i.e. in which activity you were involved in the production. Depending on your selection, further fields will appear that ask for additional parameters regarding your report.
- Clicking **Cancel** (3) closes the message dialog window and returns you to the product search. The same applies to the X at the top right of the window.
- If you want to submit the report anonymously, you can do so by clicking on the corresponding **box** (4).

A **progression bar** (5) in the middle of the window shows the process of data entry for the report of the corresponding production.

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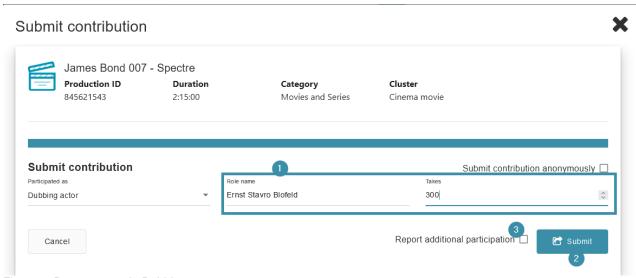


Figure 1: Report example Dubbing actor

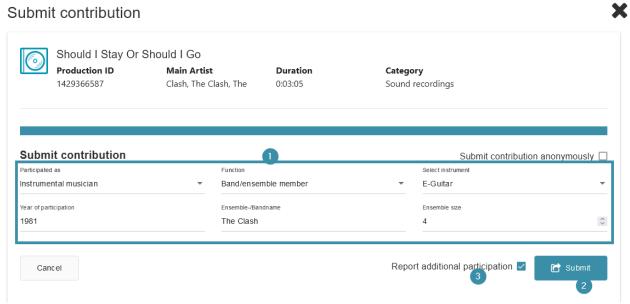


Figure 2: Report example Instrumental musician

Depending on the type of contribution, further input fields will open in the title list (1). Here you will
be asked for specific parameters of your participation report. These differ depending on the
participation role. In the first example (Figure 1), you are asked for the role name and the number
of recorded takes for reporting as a dubbing actor. The second example (Figure 2) shows a report
for a music production.

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- The **button** (2) in the lower right corner allows you to complete the report. The button "Report" is grayed out and deactivated until all required information has been entered.
- If you want to submit another report for example for a participation in another function for the selected production, simply check the **corresponding box** (3).

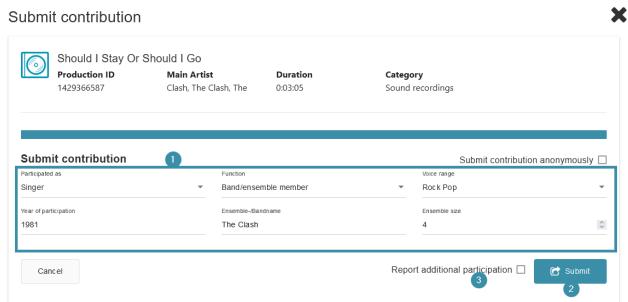


Figure 3: If the box is checked, a subsequent report for the same production can be submitted.

After successful submission of the contribution, a text will appear confirming receipt of your participation report. The window then closes automatically and takes you back to the product search. If several productions have been selected for reporting that cannot be combined into a collective report, the respective report dialog appears automatically after the previous report has been submitted. In this way, it is possible to immediately submit a contribution for the same production with different parameters (Figure 3).

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Collective reports

In some cases, reports can also be submitted in bundled form:

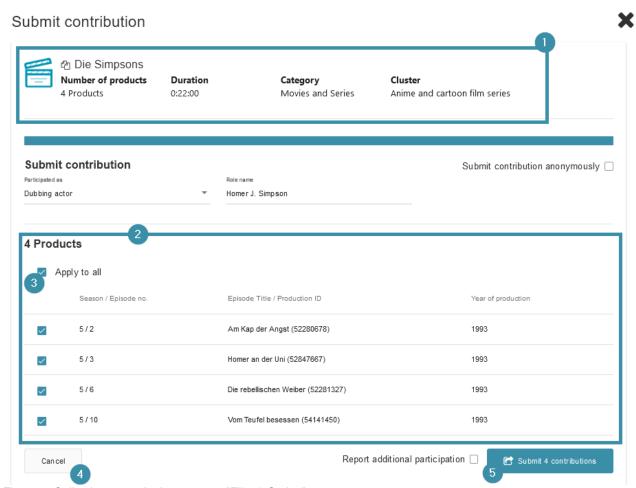


Figure 4: Collective report in the category "Film & Series"

- In the "Film and Series" category, productions with identical titles, usually episodes of series or serials, are shown bundled when selected at the same time (see Figure 4).

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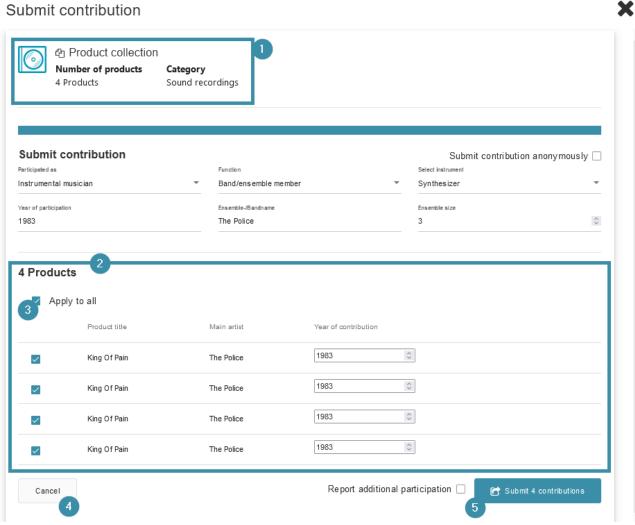


Figure 5: Collective report in the categorie "Sound recordings"

- In the category "**Sound recordings**", all productions selected at the same time are shown bundled together. In this way, identical contribution types can be reported in one go if, for example, you were a permanent band member or studio musician for all tracks (see Figure 5).

In such a collective report, a **product collection** including the number of products intended for reporting is summarized in the upper third (1). In the lower part of the page there is an **overview** (2) of the selected productions with the corresponding production number. By clicking on the boxes, individual results can be selected or deselected and thus excluded from or added to the report. A click on "**Apply for all**" (3) selects all titles selected in the product search for the report.

By clicking on "Cancel" (4) the reporting process will be terminated prematurely and you will return to the product search. If further reports are to be submitted for these selected products, this can be done via the checkbox. When all necessary parameters have been entered, the collective report can be submitted via the corresponding **button** (5) at the bottom right of the page.

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Example search queries

A few basic tips on how to search for products:

- 1. <u>Make it as simple as possible</u>. The use of filters is optional. They are there to narrow down the number of hits if a search has too many results. In many cases, however, it is quite sufficient to search for the name of a production and, if necessary, to limit it to a category.
- 2. Add filters only selectively. If step 1 does not lead to the desired result, another single filter may help:
 - In the case of sound carriers, it is often purposeful to make an entry in the field "Main artist".
 - In the category "Film and series", for example, an entry in the field "Director" often leads to the desired result.
- 3. <u>Use quotation marks</u>. In the free text search as well as the text filters you can also make use of quotation marks. In this way, the entire group of words is searched for. Deviating results will no longer be taken into account. The search for "SOKO Köln" will then no longer return results that contain only the terms "SOKO" or "Köln".

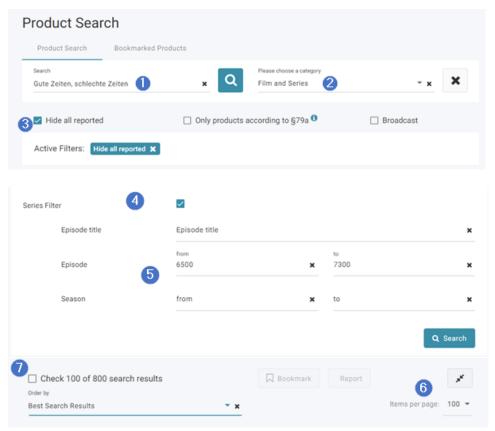
Of course, these are only examples. Other approaches are also possible. For example, you can search for your own name in the free text field or, if necessary, in the "main interpreter" field. Please note, however, that not all names are always stored in the production data.

Some example search queries can be found in the following section.

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Acting and dubbing



If you are an **actor or actress** and have played a consistent role in a series (in this case a daily soap) and would like to report your participation, it may be helpful to use the series filters of the product search.

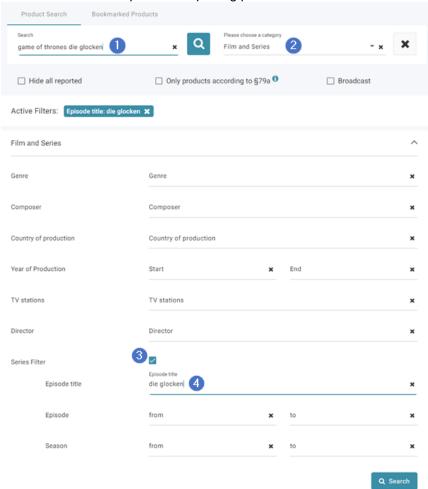
- Enter the name of the series in the "Search" (1) field.
- Select the category "Film and Series" (2). Further filter options will then appear. Daily soaps usually have continuous episode numbers, with the help of which you can specifically report the episodes in which you have participated.
- It is also advisable to select the "Hide all reported" (3) option throughout the reporting process to avoid duplicate reports.
- Next, select the item "Series Filter" (4).
- Under "Episode" (5), enter the corresponding episode numbers or the range of episode numbers for a longer period of participation. Then click the magnifying glass or "Search" to display the search results.
- You can report up to 100 episodes at once by first selecting 100 at "Items per page" (6). Now tick
 the checkbox "Preselect 100 of ... search results" (7) on the left above the search results, and
 then click the "Report" button.

In the next step, you only need to select the name and role of the contributor, enter your role name in the production and, if applicable, the number of shooting days. Complete the reporting process by clicking on the "Report participation (Mitwirkung melden)" button. See also "The report dialog".

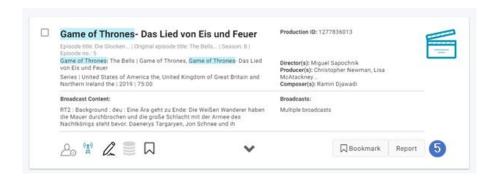


The steps are very similar if you want to report a participation as **a dubbing actor**. Let's assume you have dubbed a character that only appears in one particular episode of a series.

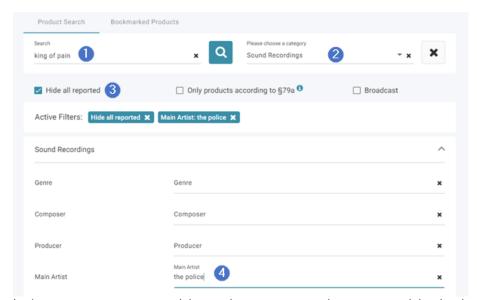
- In the "Search" (1) field, enter the name of the series and the title of the corresponding episode.
- Select the production category "Film and Series" (2). Then click on the magnifying glass or "Search" to display the search results. Normally, this should already lead to the desired result if both the name of the series and the title of the episode are unique.
- If the desired episode is not among the search results or the number of matches is too high, it may also be useful to use the series filters of the search mask.
- To do this, click on the "Series Filter" (3) item.
- Enter the name of the episode you are looking for in the **"Episode title"** (4) field. Then start the search process by clicking on the magnifying glass or pressing the "Enter" key.
- Now select the desired production from the hit list and click on "Report" (5). This will take you to
 the <u>report dialog</u>, where you can enter the type of participation and, if applicable, the role name in
 the production as well as the number of takes. Click the "Report participation (Mitwirkung melden)"
 button to complete the reporting process.







Singers and musicians



Let's assume you are a musician and you want to register your participation in a certain song.

- To do this, enter the title of the song in the "Search" (1) field.
- Select "Sound Recordings" (2) as the category. Further filter options will then appear.
- It is also advisable to select the "Hide all reported" (3) button for each search to avoid duplicate reports.
 - For this example case we are searching for the song "King Of Pain" by "The Police". Without specifying any other filters, more than 30,000 results will appear for this song.
- In this case, it is advisable to use the "Main Artist" (4) filter by entering "The Police" in this field and clicking the magnifying glass to search. After that, only releases with this song title by the band "The Police" will appear.
- To subsequently register your participation in all search results, select the appropriate number of "Items per page" and click on "Check ...of ... search results" (depending on how many search results are displayed).

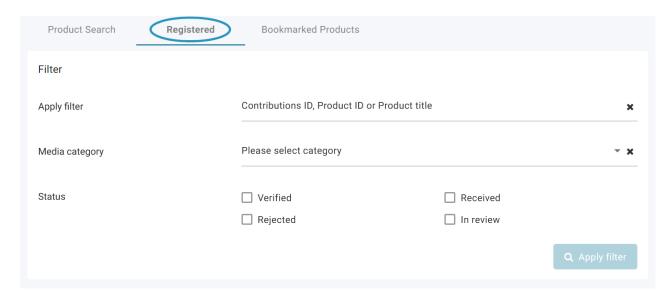

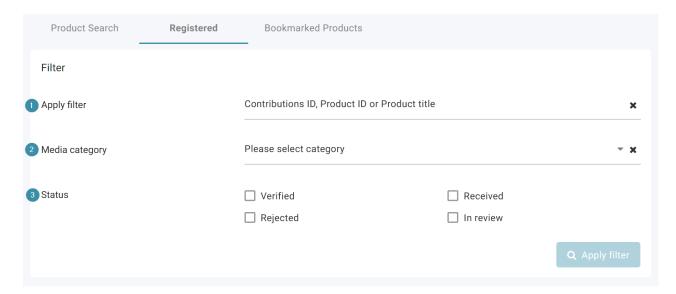
Registered

After you have successfully completed the reporting process for one or more productions, they appear in the corresponding "Reported" area. It provides a detailed overview of the reports we have received, the current state of processing and, where applicable, information on reasons for rejection.

There are several ways to access this overview. Either via the corresponding button in the main menu under "Service" on the left-hand side or via the "Reported" tab within the product search.



Basically, this area is structured similarly to the product search. Thus, after you have called up the list with the submitted reports, some filter opens appear.



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Filter options

To provide a better overview within the reported tab, for example to find certain reported productions faster, various filter options are available. To apply a filter, simply make a corresponding entry and click the "Apply filter" button. Alternatively, the filter process is also triggered automatically as soon as an entry is made.

Apply filter (1):

Reported products are searched according to various parameters. These include the product title, the product id of the corresponding entry or the contribution number linked to an individual notification. Production number and participation number are also displayed in the corresponding report entry. More on this below. This field requires an input of at least two characters.

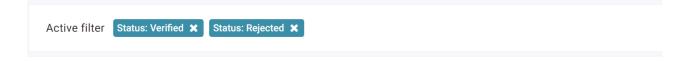
Category (2):

Here, a drop-down menu can be used to filter within the different product categories - film and series, sound recordings, radio productions, stage productions, video clips.

Status (3):

By selecting one or more options with a click in the corresponding box, only those participation reports that match the corresponding processing status are displayed. More about this in the following section.

Active filters are displayed **in the bar below** the filter window and can be deselected again by clicking on the x.



Production list / hit list

Below the filters you will find - in the layout very similar to the product search - a list with the contributions reported by you. If active, these are limited by the applied filters. <u>Like in the product search, you can select single or a certain number of productions and increase the number of "products per page" to a maximum of one hundred.</u>



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Clicking on the box "Check X of Y products" (1) marks all entries on a page. The number X represents the number of displayed participations per page, whereas Y is the total sum of products on which one or more participations reports are listed.

Selected reports can be resubmitted by clicking on the **"Report"** button (2), if you participated in additional functions.

Via "Export all contributions" (3) all submitted reports can be exported and downloaded as an Excel spreadsheet. The download starts automatically.

Please note: Currently its only possible to export a maximum of 10.000 contributions. If you've submitted more contributions, please contact us.

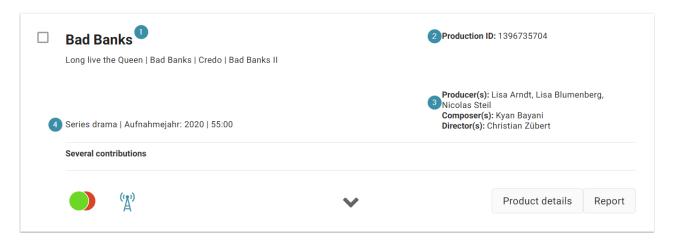
In addition, all product details displayed on one page can be expanded by clicking on the **opposing arrows** (4).

If you have used filter options to display certain reported productions, it is also possible to export only this selection. In this case, the button appears as a **drop-down menu** (1), where you can choose between exporting all or only the filtered contributions.



In contrary to the former display - a list of submitted contributions - the respective productions for which the logged-in beneficiary has submitted a contribution are now displayed. The most recent submission will be displayed first.

Here is an example of an episode of the show "Bad Banks":



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There, in addition to the **product title** (as well as original, episode or subtitle) (1), you will also find, depending on media type and availability, various other information, such as **product id** (2), excerpts from the **cast list** (3), as well as **genre**, **production or recording year or production length** (4).

The lower third of the production tile offers further information and options that improve the transparency of the submitted reports.



In addition to the aforementioned **transmission mast icon** (1), which indicates a currently relevant use of the production by means of blue coloring, this also includes the option of using the "**Product details**" button (2) to open the corresponding production in the product search, including any additional information available there. Furthermore, the "**Report**" button (3) allows you to open the report dialog for the product and, if necessary, to submit a new report.

By clicking on the arrow (4) in the lower center of the tile, the cast list can be expanded or collapsed.

The processing status

The production-based view of the reported section shows at a glance how many reports have been submitted for a production and in which processing status they are: the correspondingly colored symbol at the bottom left (highlighted here by an arrow) provides information on how far your report has already been processed.

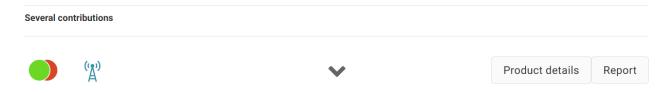


Above the symbol you will find details of the contributions you have submitted on the product under "Contribution reports" (1):

If only contribution has been submitted for the corresponding product, the most important information about this submission will be displayed briefly and concisely:

- the current processing status (2), indicated by the corresponding symbol
- the participation id (3), under which the notification is managed within the GVL
- the specified contribution role (4) or additional details of the contribution.

If **several reports** have been submitted for one production, this is initially indicated by "Several contributions".

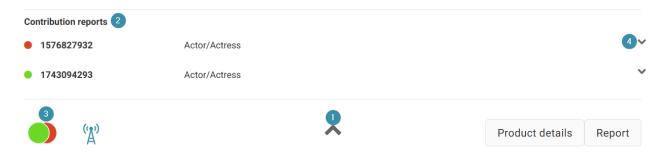


Clicking on the **arrow symbol** (1) opens the **detailed view** (2) for all received participation reports - which is closed again with a second click. At the same time, in the case of multiple notifications, several **overlapping symbols** (3) for the respective processing status can be found in the lower left corner

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according to the number of contributions submitted. In the case of an existing verified message, the green indicator is always displayed as the "topmost" one.



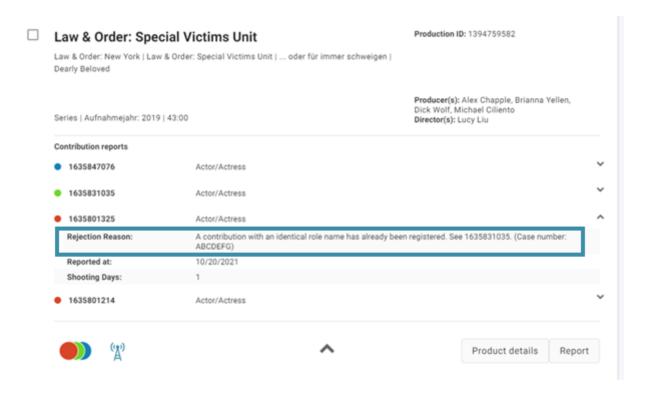
Additional information can also be displayed for each submitted report. To do this, simply click on the **small arrow** (4) on the right-hand side next to the corresponding submission.

Here, in addition to the time of the report ("Reported at:"), the specified parameters can be viewed depending on the product type (e.g. sound carrier or TV production). For example, the number of shooting days or takes, the year of participation and, in the case of reports on audiovisual productions, the role name.

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In addition, the rejection reason is also displayed in case of declined contribution reports.



More information about the possible reasons for rejection can be found below.

The following processing statuses exist:

- Verified: The participation notification has been reviewed and conclusively processed by us. Relevant usages of the corresponding production are remunerated.
- Received: The contribution notification has been successfully transmitted to us and will be checked automatically or manually in a timely manner.
- Rejected: After a final review, the message could not be verified, because a participation could not be confirmed. The exact reason for rejection is provided in the respective report.
- In validation: The submission is currently being processed. If necessary, we will contact you for a proof of contribution.

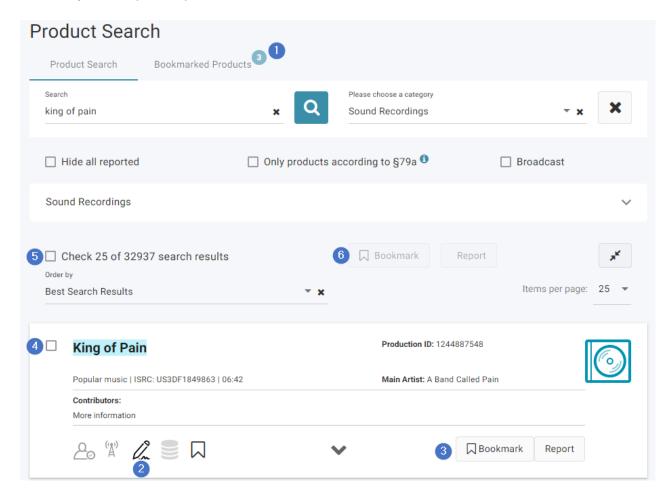
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Bookmarked

If you want to bookmark found products at first, in order to submit a participation report at a later time, you can add these to a list of bookmarked products.

You can access this list either via the "Bookmarked" button in the menu or via the "Bookmarked products" tab directly at the top of the product search.



- There you find a **circle** (1), that indicates how many products you have already bookmarked, if applicable.
- To bookmark a product that you have found via the product search, click on the **bookmark symbol** (2) in the product display or on the **"Bookmark"** (3) button.
- You can also mark several products from the result list and bookmark this selection. To do this, place a check mark in the **small square** (4) to the left of the product title. Clicking again cancels the selection.
- By clicking on the small square to the left of the display of the total number of search results, all results of the respective page can be marked in total, i.e. 10, 25, 100 or 500 products, depending

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on the display setting. This process can also be undone by clicking again. In addition, you can deselect or reselect individual products in the results list by clicking on **the square** next (5) to the corresponding title.

• If you want to mark several products at once, please use the "Bookmark" button (6) at the top of the page, directly below the filter area.

Please note: Collective products cannot be marked.

The list of bookmarked products is basically structured like the results list of the product search. Instead of the bookmark icon, however, you will find a trash can icon there to remove products from the list again. You also have the option of selecting and removing several productions or the entire page.

You can also start the report dialog from the list of bookmarked products and report contributions. For more information, please refer to the chapter "Submitting participation reports".

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My Data

Clicking on the corresponding button in the menu under "Service" opens the "My Data" section. This provides an overview of the master data stored at GVL for the currently logged-in beneficiary. This section is divided into three sections, which can be selected by clicking on the respective tab: **Personal data** (1), **Financial data** (2) and **Pseudonyms** (3). The name of the selected section is **underlined in blue**.



Personal data

In this area, you can view and edit the master data stored in our system.

The fields "Personal data" (1) and "Contact" (2) contain the name, e-mail address and telephone number of the person logged in as well as their GVL contract number and GVL-ID. While the contract number is used to log in to my.gvl, the GVL-ID is a unique identification number that can also be found, for example, on the documents provided by GVL or in the purpose of bank transfers. If rights holders are registered with GVL in several functions, they will have several IDs. If productions are also used internationally, an IPN (International Performer Number) may also be displayed with the personal data. It serves to identify rights holders in the international exchange of collecting societies.

Small symbols marked with a question mark display information on the individual fields when the mouse pointer hovers over them.

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The "Address information" section on the right-hand side is divided into two categories, which can be selected via the corresponding tabs: "Registration address" (1) and "Correspondence address" (2). If you have not entered a different address to which the letters from GVL will be sent, the latter tab will be empty.



Change of personal data

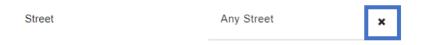
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To add or change your personal data, click on the "Edit" button at the top.



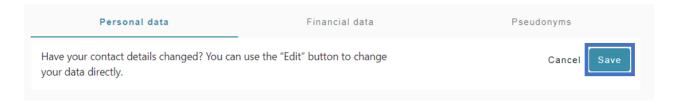
The editing function is intuitively designed. You can delete entries using the "x" behind the lines that can be changed. Alternatively, you can simply click in the relevant field and change the entries.



If you delete a mandatory field, you will be shown in red that it needs to be filled. If you have deleted a field by mistake, you can restore the last entry by clicking on the **clock symbol with the back arrow** on the right.

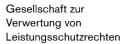


To finish editing and save your changes, click on "Save" at the top.



To change the salutation, title, first name or last name, we need the new data as well as a scan of the ID document (or the scan of the commercial register excerpt for event organizers) by e-mail to kuenstlervertrag@gvl.de. You can trigger a pre-filled e-mail directly by clicking on the e-mail address shown in the corresponding note. Your mail program will then open. You can edit the pre-filled e-mail, attach documents and send it directly.

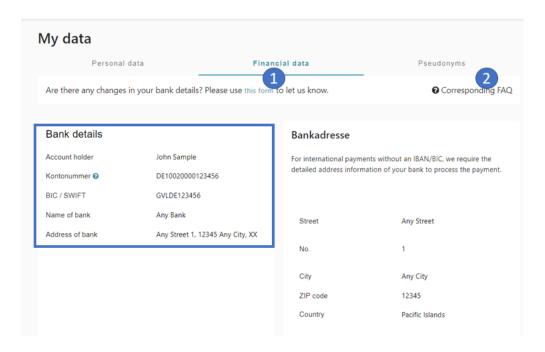
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Financial data

The tab "Financial data" starts with a **notice** (1) that in case of a change of the bank details of the logged in person the linked form must be used. In addition, there is a **link** (2) to the corresponding FAQ on gvl.de on the right. Please note that the link opens in a new tab and leads out of the artist portal my.GVL.

In the lower half you can see the provided bank details. For international banks without IBAN/BIC, the bank's address data may be displayed.



Pseudonyms

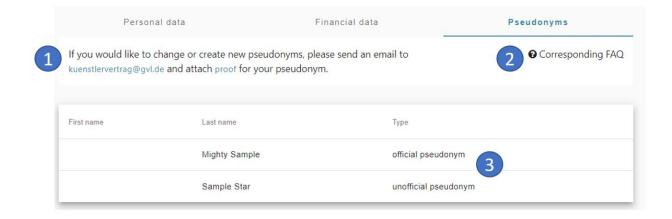
This tab provides an overview of the stored pseudonyms of the logged-in beneficiary. Here you will find the **note** (1) that an e-mail to <u>kuenstlervertrag@gvl</u>.de is required to create or change pseudonyms. Please note that we require appropriate evidence or proof for pseudonym entries.

Additionally, **a link** (2) leads to the corresponding FAQ on gvl.de.

In the middle of the section you will find - should you be registered at GVL with pseudonyms - an overview of these. Aliases are distinguished into **official and unofficial pseudonyms** (3). The former must be listed in identification documents to be accepted by us. You can read more about this in the <u>FAQ</u>.

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My documents

The "My Documents" button in the Service menu takes you to the area with the same name, where you can view and manage the documents provided by the GVL as part of its distributions.

For GVL members who have filled out a digital online performance contract, a copy of it can be found in an additional tab called "**Rights administration agreement**".

By clicking on the respective tab, the corresponding documents are displayed. The GVL provides its rightsholders with two different types of documents - depending on the distribution: "**Payout information**" (1) and "**Detailed distribution reports**" (2). Further information on the differences and distinctive features can be found on <u>our homepage</u>.

In addition, **a link** (3) leads to the corresponding part in the "Frequently Asked Questions" on gvl.de. Please note that this link leads out of my.GVL and the page opens in a new window or tab.

The files provided by GVL are usually saved in "Portable Document Format" (.pdf) (payout notifications & detailed distribution reports). To view them, you will therefore need <u>Adobe Acrobat Reader</u> or an equivalent program that can open the file type (for example, "Preview" on Apple devices). We also provide detailed distribution reports as **Excel documents** (.xlsx), which can be opened with **Microsoft Office** or <u>Open Office</u>, for example.

According to their nature, the stored documents are grouped either by **payment year** (Payout notifications), i.e. the year in which the remuneration was paid, or by **year of use** (Detailed distribution reports). Detailed reports contain all **remunerated participation reports for a specific year of use**, so that it is possible to see how the claims for a specific year are made up.



Below you can find your detailed distribution reports grouped by the year of usage.

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For both document types, the view is initially largely identical. As soon as one of the tabs has been selected, tiles appear that are provided with **a date** (1) - in accordance with the type of grouping.

On the right side of the tile (2), you can see how many documents or files are stored for the respective year. A click on the **arrow** (3) "unfolds" the respective tile and shows those documents that were created by the GVL for the logged-in person in a list. Another click on the arrow closes the list overview again.

Payout information

If the list overview of a certain year is opened for the payout notifications, all files of this document type are displayed that were created for this year for the logged-in person. Different columns show additional information about the files.

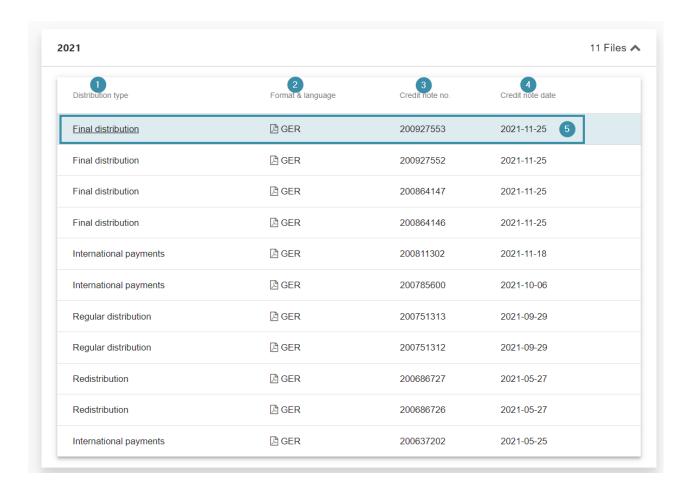
The column "**Distribution type**" (1) indicates for which type of distribution the corresponding AZM was created. More about the different distributions of the GVL can be found here. "**Format & Language**" (2) indicates in which language and in which file type the document is available: Payout notifications are always stored in .pdf format.

Under "Credit note number" (3), the numbering of the respective document can be viewed at a glance without having to open or download the file. The "Credit note date" (4) indicates the date (in the format YYYY.MM.DD) on which the document was created.

Hovering over an entry (5) will highlight it in blue, clicking on it the list view automatically starts the download of the corresponding document. Depending on the settings of your browser, the file will open by itself afterwards. In any case, it can be found in the download folder of the end device used.

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Detailed distribution reports

The detailed distribution reports not only indicate which productions have been remunerated for a specific year of use and to what extent, but also how high the expected total distribution for the respective year of use is. The projected sum shows how much money you are expected to receive at the end of the reporting period. Since this sum depends on a wide variety of factors, it is always adjusted. For this reason, each year you will receive a new, updated version of the detailed report and thus also of the projected total for the year of use. For this reason, the stored documents here are not sorted by creation date, but by the individual years of use.

Clicking on one of the **arrows** within a tile in the "Detail distribution reports" tab opens the list overview of all documents that have been created for the corresponding year of use.

Different columns provide additional information about the respective document. The "**Document type**" (1) indicates that the available files are detail reports. Since detail reports are available in German and English,





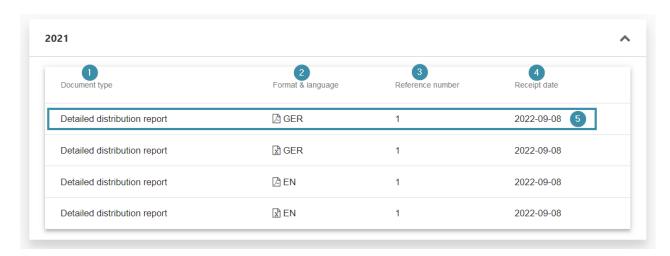
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as well as in the file types .pdf and .xlsx, the column "Format & Language" (2) indicates which specific document is it.

The "Reference number" (3) shows how many distributions have already been made for the respective year of use. In this way, it is possible to distinguish more quickly between different detailed reports for a year of use. Please note that detailed distribution reports for the Radio/TV-extra formats are always labelled with the reference number 99. The "Receipt date" (4) informs about the date (format YYYY.MM.DD) on which the corresponding detail report has been created. The most recent detail report can always be found at the top of the list.

Clicking on an **entry** (5) in the list view automatically starts the download of the corresponding document. Depending on the settings of your browser, the file will open by itself afterwards. In any case, it can be found in the download folder of the end device used.



Rights administration agreement

If the logged-in person has signed a purely digital rights administration agreement with the GVL, a version of this contract will be stored in an additional tab. Older contracts are not yet visible here and the tab is hidden accordingly.

In the upper third of the page there is an explanatory note as well as a **link** (1) to the corresponding section in the FAQ of gvl.de. Please note that this link leads out of my.GVL and opens in a new tab.

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Below that, there is a single tile noting on the left side the **year** (2) in which the performance contract was concluded. Click on the **arrow** (3) to expand the tile and open a list overview.

If the list overview is opened, the entry of the administration agreement appears, including the **date of the conclusion of the agreement** (in the format YYYY.MM.DD) (4).

Clicking on the **entry** (5) starts the download of the contract in .pdf format. Depending on the browser settings of the end device used, the document will then open automatically. Clicking the arrow again closes the tile and thus the list view again.

Open cases

If we need your assistance in processing your participation reports, we will contact you via the "Open cases" area, e.g. if proof of your participation is required. You will then be informed by e-mail that new cases exist and that you need to take action.

You open the "Open cases" area via the corresponding entry in the menu or with the button at the top right. The circle with the number shows you how many open cases exist.



Search and filter options in the "Open cases" section

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If there are multiple open cases, you have several options to limit or change the display.



- In the "Search for ..." field (1), you can search within the open cases for case ID, production title, episode title or episode number. Please enter only one search term and pay attention to upper and lower case letters.
- In the "Filter" (2) field, you can filter by different case types, if they are present:
 - Upload evidence
 - o Rejection/Appeal
 - o Acknowledge Refusal
 - o Acknowledge Registration Error
 - o Acknowledge Refusal of Appeal
 - Acknowledge Registration Error

More detailed information on the individual case types can be <u>found below</u>..

- In the "Sort by" field (3) you can sort the cases according to the following criteria:
 - Case name
 - Due by
 - o Priority
 - o Created on
- In the "Items per page" field (4) you can adjust the number of cases displayed per page (5, 10 or 25).

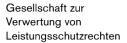
The different types of cases

Tip: We have created explanatory videos/tutorials for operating the open cases, which you can find in the help section of my.gvl. To do so, click on "Help" in the menu and then on "Video-Tutorials".

1. Case type: "Upload evidence"



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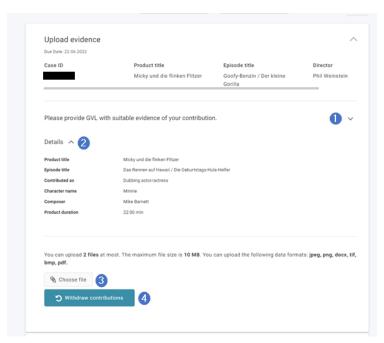
This case type is created when we need evidence from you to confirm your participation report. In the header of the open case you will see the **due date** (1), **the case ID** (2) and the **relevant title information** (3).

Please note: If no proof is uploaded until the due date, the notification will be rejected because it has expired.

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Open the case by clicking on it.



If required, you can expand it even further. Under (1) an **info text** shows you which three conditions your proof must fulfill: It refers to the reported production, it confirms the nature of your contribution, and it is not a self-receipt. Under (2) you will find **further information** about the production and your participation report(s).

Important: If you notice due to the verification request that you have submitted the notification by mistake and did not participate in the production at all, you can also withdraw the notification by clicking on the button "Withdraw contribution" (4).

Use the **"Choose file" button** (3) to start uploading the file and open the upload window shown below. You have the option to select and attach up to two documents.



The maximum size per file is 10 MB. Allowed are the file formats jpeg, png, docx, tif, bmp and pdf. Via the blue button "Submit evidence" (1) the selected documents will be sent to GVL for verification. You can also remove an accidentally selected document by clicking on the red button "Remove file" (3). Under "Evidence files" (2) you can see the selected files that are about to be submitted.

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If we need evidence for several tracks of an album or several episodes of a series, these are bundled in one case if possible, depending on the data quality.



You can mark individual tracks/episodes to which the proof documents you upload refer. After submitting, a new case is created with the remaining tracks/episodes.

2. Case type "Rejection / Appeal"

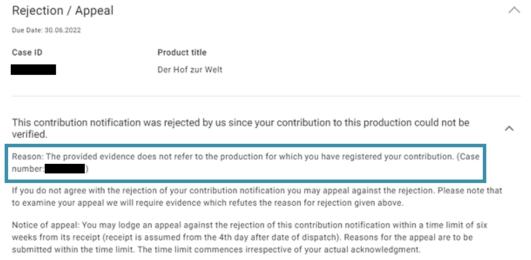
This case type is created when one of your participation notifications has been rejected. The display corresponds to the "Upload evidence" case type: In the header you will see the **due date** (1), the **case ID** (2) and the **relevant title information** (3). Please note: An appeal to a rejection can only be submitted up to the due date.

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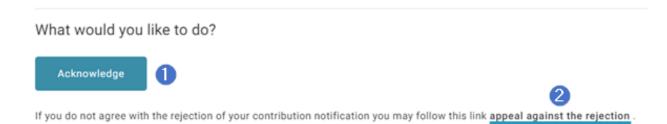




By clicking on the case and the arrow symbols, you can expand the details. The reason for the rejection will always be displayed there. (An overview of all possible rejection reasons can be found <u>later in this chapter</u>).



Further down, you can either acknowledge the rejection by pressing the **blue button** (1) or file an objection by clicking on the **bold text** (2).



In the course of the appeal, you again have the option of uploading conclusive proof documents. Please continue reading above under <u>"Upload evidence".</u>

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3. Case type "Acknowledge refusal of appeal"

If your objection is rejected, you will also be informed of the reason for rejection in the detailed view of the case. There is no possibility to object again. You can take note of the rejection by pressing the corresponding button.

4. Case type "Acknowledge refusal"

In this type of case, it is no longer possible to file an objection. These are usually a) rejections for which the objection period has expired, or b) rejections of duplicates, i.e. reports that already exist identically to this production and are therefore redundant. In this case, the rejection reason always contains a note on the already existing contribution and the corresponding contribution number, e.g. " A contribution with an identical role name has already been registered. See 123456789."

5. Case type "Acknowledge registration error"

This case type displays participation reports that cannot be processed further for technical reasons and must therefore be rejected. For example, important information may be missing, such as the selection of a function or the specification of shooting days or takes - depending on the type of participation report. You will find a concrete reason for the rejection in the detailed view of the case.

Usually, when submitting contribution reports, all necessary parameters must be specified so that such faulty reports do not arise in the first place. However, due to the complexity of the different combinations of contributor roles, genres and media types, this "safety net" has not always worked in the past, so that occasionally defective reports still have to be retrieved and rejected.

Please check if there is already a correct report for this production. If necessary, report again or feel free to contact us if you are unsure.

6. Case type "Acknowledge contribution conflict"

If you have contributed to a production in numerous ways, you generally have the option of submitting reports for all of these different activities, provided that GVL evaluates the respective contribution role. However, there are activities that cannot be reported at the same time because they contradict each other. For example, it is not possible to report both roles as conductor and studio conductor in one production, or artistic producer and conductor at the same time. If such a contradictory report is detected, it will be rejected. In the details of the case, you will find the reason for rejection with a reference to the existing report.

For more information on the compensation of multiple contributions and conflicting reports, please see our FAQ: How many of my contributions will be compensated if I contributed to a production in different ways?

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Overview of possible reasons for rejection

In the following, we document for you all the reasons for rejection that are possible and could be mentioned in the details of an open case. The high number is due to the fact that we want to provide you with the most detailed information possible. Especially the case type "Acknowledge registration error" can display a multitude of faulty combinations in relation to a participation report.

Each reason for rejection contains the transaction number to which it refers, represented here by {0}. Some rejection reasons also refer to an already existing, different report and contain its participation number for traceability, represented here by {1}. You can find an overview of your existing participation reports in the "Registered" area.

- A contribution with an equivalent combination of role, function and, if applicable, vocal range/instrument has already been registered. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- A contribution with an identical role name has already been registered. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- A contribution of the choir/orchestra has already been registered by the choir/orchestra representative. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- The provided combination of attributes is not plausible. Please contact us. (Case number: {0})
- Coexisting contribution registrations as conductor and artistic producer are prohibited. See {1}.
 (Case number: {0})
- Coexisting contribution registrations as conductor and studio conductor are prohibited. See {1}.
 (Case number: {0})
- Multiple coexisting contribution registrations as singer and with identical functions but differing vocal ranges are prohibited. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- Multiple coexisting contribution registrations as instrumental musician with identical instruments are prohibited. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- Coexisting contribution registrations as band or ensemble member and soloist are prohibited. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- Coexisting contribution registrations as choir singer and conductor are prohibited. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- Coexisting contribution registrations as orchestra musician and conductor are prohibited. See {1}. (Case number: {0})
- The deadline for submission of proof (6 weeks) has expired. (Case number: {0})
- The provided evidence has been accepted. (Case number: {0})
- The provided evidence does not confirm the type of contribution you have registered. (Case number: {0})

- Self-confirmations cannot be considered as a valid proof. (Case number: {0})
- The proof could not be considered because the signature of the confirming person/contractual party is missing. (Case number: {0})
- A bank statement or receipt of payment for the self-created invoice ist missing. (Case number: {0})
- The document submitted is not a valid form of proof. (Case number: {0})
- The proof does not confirm your function as a soloist. (Case number: {0})

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- The proof does not confirm your function as a band-/ensemble member. (Case number: {0})
- The proof does not confirm your function as a studio musician/line-up. (Case number: {0})
- The proof does not confirm your function as a background-/studio singer. (Case number: {0})
- The proof does not confirm your role as a conductor. (Case number: {0})

- The activity of voice over or translation is irrelevant under ancillary copyright law. (Case number: {0})
- Factual and informational texts are irrelevant under ancillary copyright law. (Case number: {0})
- Not a small spoken word format! Please report your participation under radio production spoken word. (Case number: {0})
- The selected role is not applicable for this product. (Case number: {0})
- The music part is missing. (Case number: {0})
- This function is not applicable for the selected role. (Case number: {0})

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Small Literary Formats (SLF)

A small spoken word format refers to short contributions (exclusively in radio), usually 1-2 minutes long up to a maximum of 10 minutes, which are included in broadcasts that are not available in the product search.

This can be, for example, a daily changing sketch in a morning show or a sketch/poem/gloss in a broadcast that is not available in the product search due to its general irrelevance to performance protection law.

A "Small Literary Format" (SLF) is defined as a short radio report, usually one to two minutes long (but no longer than 10 minutes), which is included in broadcasts that are not made available in the product search. This can be, for example, a daily changing sketch in a morning magazine or a poem/slogan or similar in a program not available in the database with content irrelevant to performance protection law.

If you have participated in a production to which the above explanations apply, you can use an online form to create a new small word format and register a contribution for it.

To do this, click on the button "Small Literary Formats" in the main menu under "Service".

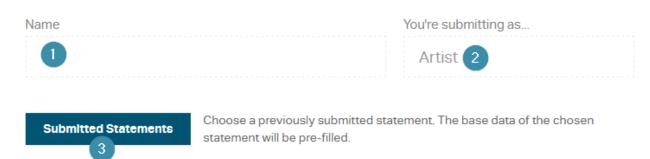

Personal info



At the top you will see your **name** (1) and the technical information that you are registering as a **performing artist** (2).

The **button below** (3) opens an overview of already reported small word formats. More on this below.

Creating a new Small Literary Format

When you create a report on a Small Literary Format, in addition to information about the manner of your involvement, we always require information about the product in question and how it is being used or broadcast.

Product:

At this point, the central information for the creation of the SLF is requiered. This includes:

- **Production name** (1): The most precise possible **title** of the small word format (e.g.: "Die WDR2 Ampel WG")
- Recording year (2): the year in which the production was recorded
- Production duration (3): The length of the Small Literary Format in mm:ss format (e.g. for a contribution length of one minute and 30 seconds: 01:30) The maximum production duration must not exceed 10 minutes.
- Participation role (4): The type of your contribution. Only the roles "artistic speaker/narrator"
 (Künstlerische*r Sprecher*in/Erzähler*in and "dubbing director" (Wortregisseur), which are
 relevant in the spoken word area, are available here. Multiple entries are possible if you have
 performed both activities.



Product



Clicking on the "i" symbol (5) opens a tooltip that provides additional information about the required entries. This applies to all other input fields.

Broadcasts:

Here, you enter details on the use of the respective Small Literary Format.

To do this, select the **year of broadcast** (1) and the **broadcaster** (2). Both fields are filled in via a drop-down menu. The **X** behind the selected entry can be used to cancel the selection.

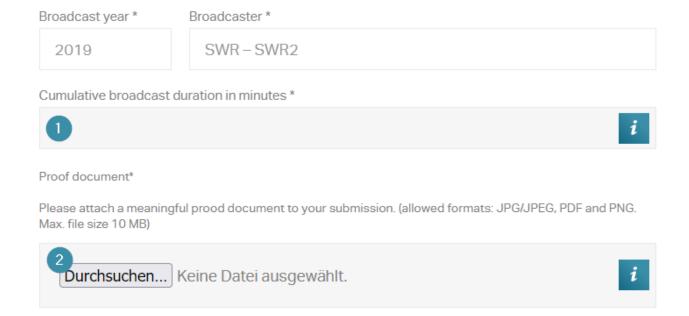


Please note:

- Additional uses on other stations or in other years can be added to the report gradually. A
 description follows below.
- Not all stations are available in every usage year. Please consult the <u>distribution schedules</u> for details on the stations being evaluated.

Clicking on "Add" (3) opens additional input fields that ask for further details of the corresponding broadcast.



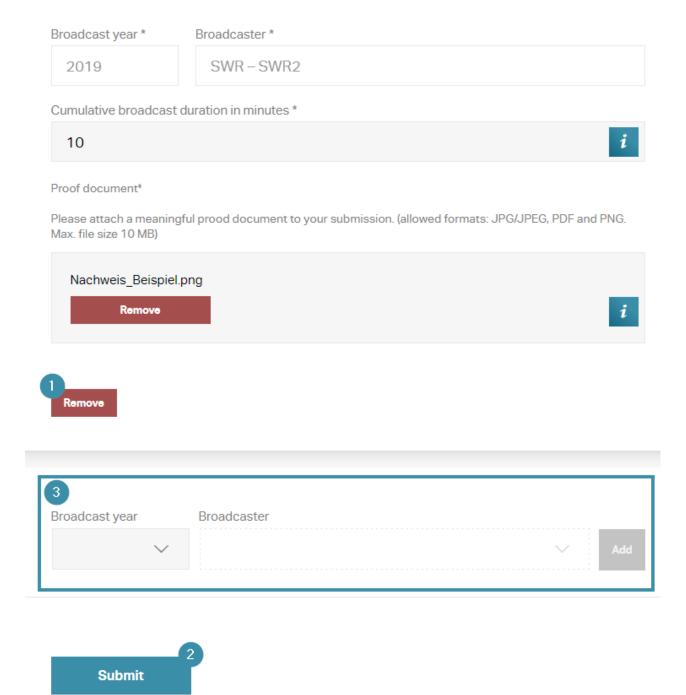


Please enter here the **total broadcast duration** (1) of the SLF in the respective broadcast year on the selected station - in other words, **the total length of all broadcasts**. Only whole numbers (that means without decimal places) are possible as input here. Please round up or down as appropriate.



Finally, it is necessary to submit a conclusive proof in .JPG/JPEG, .PDF or .PNG formats. For this purpose, it is sufficient to click on "**Browse**" (2) ("**Durchsuchen**") and select the corresponding file via the window that opens. By clicking on the red "Remove" box, the selected evidence can be deleted again.





The lower, red-colored button "**Remove**" (1) deletes all broadcast information if you want to undo a reporting step.

After all the information for the particular use has been entered in full, it is possible to submit the report using the "**Submit**" button (2), or to add another broadcast with changed parameters (different broadcaster / different year of broadcast) to the same Small Literary Format (3).

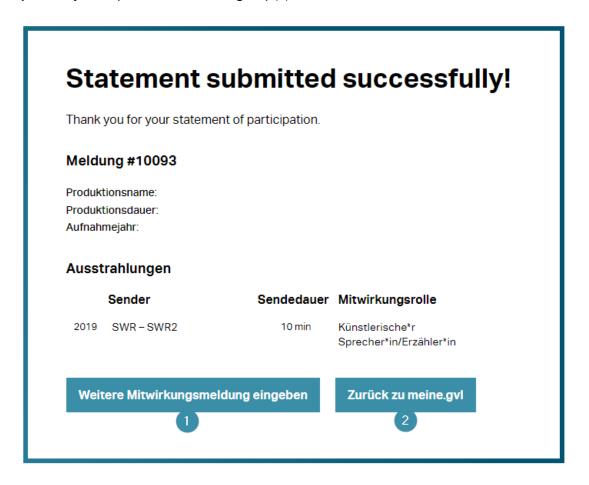


If any necessary parameters are still missing from the input mask when you click on "Submit", the form jumps to the appropriate place and displays a note, for example, if there is a missing entry in the "Cumulative broadcast duration in minutes" field:

If a report has been submitted correctly, an appearing window confirms its receipt and offers the possibility to submit further reports ("Weitere Mitwirkungsmeldung eingeben") (1) or to return to the artist portal my.GVL ("Zurück zu meine.gvl.") (2).



Use of already submitted Small Literary Formats as template



It is also possible to use entered data from previously submitted reports as a template. To do this, click on the "**Submitted statements**" button. A new window will open with an overview of previously submitted Small Literary Formats.

The **view summarizes the submitted formats** (1) and shows the entered parameters - year of recording or broadcast, production name & broadcasting station, production or broadcast duration, as well as the contribution role and the statement date.

If both possible contribution roles have been specified, the **respective reports** (2) are listed one below the other.

In the center, the **current processing status** (3) of the reported Small Literary Format is displayed; in addition, in case of rejected reports, the reason for the rejection can also be found by clicking on "**Rejected**" ("**Abgelehnt**") (4).



Clicking on the **bold title** (5) of a reported small word format uses the entered report parameters (production name, recording year, duration and contributor role) as a template in the form to submit a similar report - for example, for an additional year of use or a different radio station.

Please note that once a template is selected, the product details cannot be changed, only the contribution role and broadcast details.

The **buttons on the upper right side** (6) allow to export a list of already submitted reports as Excel spreadsheet or PDF document. The download starts automatically. In addition, a click on the "**Print page**" button triggers the print dialog of the browser used.

Radio/TV extra formats

The Radio/TV are a comparatively small sub-budgets, which account for less than 3 percent of the total distribution volume of the GVL for artists per year of use, and for which we are unable to provide usage reports from the TV and radio stations. The distribution amounts result primarily from private copy levies and are only settled once as part of a final distribution.

Participation reports for productions that belong to the Radio TV extra formats are not submitted via the product search of the artist portal, but via a **separate online form**, that you an access by clicking on the corresponding button in the main menu. More information, as well as links to the most important questions and answers, <u>can be found on our homepage</u>.

Since we can not provide an English version of the form, we've created a glossary sheet with the most important key words and explanations. It can be found here.

Please note that this form is always available only in a certain period. About the periods in which reports can be submitted, we will inform you as usual via e-mail. The form can be accessed during the communicated reporting periods via the corresponding link in the main menu under "Service". Please note that the form will open in a new window or tabor tab and leads out of the portal area of my.GVL:

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Troubleshooting/FAQ

Below you will find a small selection of frequently asked questions regarding my.gvl. All FAQ for artists can always be found on <u>our homepage</u>.

I receive an error message when logging in - what can I do?

If you receive an error message when trying to log in to our artist portal, please follow these steps:

- 1. First, check which browser you are using. We recommend <u>Google Chrome</u> or <u>Firefox</u>. Apple's standard browser *Safari* is unfortunately only partially compatible with our portal and using it often leads to error messages.
- 2. Delete cookies and cache of your browser. This works differently depending on the browser you use:

Firefox: Menu → Preferences → Privacy & Security → Cookie and Site Data → Clear Data **Chrome**: Menu → More tools → Clear browsing data → Clear Data

- 3. Please make sure that you use your **contract number** and not the GVL ID to log in and check the correct spelling and capitalization of the password.
- 4. If necessary, click on the "Forgot password" button to receive a link for a new password and then try again. For more information, see the corresponding chapter above.
 Important: the password must not contain special characters, must be at least 8 characters long, and must contain at least one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and one number.
 Please note that the link can be used only once after that it is invalid and it is not possible to create a new password again using it.

Why can't I find a specific production?

1. First, check the **spelling**: The production is not always published under the title under which it was produced. GVL is usually only reported the title under which the production was published and broadcast in Germany. However, you can usually find out the broadcast title via the producer/label or an Internet search.

- 2. Customize the **display** of the results. Are the sorting and the number of search results per page selected appropriately to be able to see the production? Is there possibly still a filter set that unintentionally restricts your search?
- 3. In addition, there may be other reasons why a search comes up inconclusive:
 - The program information that we obtain from an external provider must first be technically processed before we can make it available in our database. As a rule, the productions of the current year are available in the portal in April/May of the following year. So if the production you're looking for was broadcast only recently, it probably hasn't found its way into our database yet.
 - Certain production types, which belong to the Radio/TV extra formats, cannot be found in our database for cost reasons. We will inform you about the current reporting modalities for these production types here.
 - In accordance with its distribution plans, GVL only evaluates stations that meet certain
 requirements, such as a minimum reach. Online usages, for example in media libraries or on
 streaming portals, are not evaluated by GVL because the legal framework conditions do not allow
 us to do so. Should anything change in this regard, we will of course inform you.

If you are unable to find the productions you are looking for, even though these conditions are met, please contact the <u>corresponding specialist team</u> who will be happy to assist you in your search.

I have accidentally reported a wrong production or entered incorrect parameters. What can I do?

Currently, you do not have the possibility to delete or edit submitted reports. If you wish to correct your report, please contact the <u>corresponding specialist team</u>. Please note that for reasons of transparency, we cannot completely delete reports, but only reject them.
